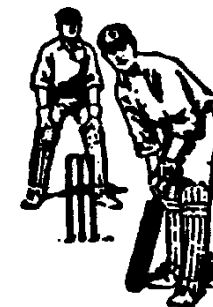

Finally, on cricket matters, our special thanks go to the band of coaches who give their time every Sunday morning, teaching up to 100 children, who also look after the junior teams, and coach during the winter. We owe them a great debt of gratitude since the future of the club is largely in their hands.

Support is extended to local cricket and not least by staging the later rounds of the Eggleston Cup at Feethams, which was again so ably organised by Jimmy Robinson.

The social life of the club has thrived and our team of ladies has hosted a variety of functions over the year, which have been very successful, though the players could have better supported some functions. Due to the funds raised, capital projects have become possible and generally the efforts by the ladies have been an invaluable help to the club. One plea I do make, and that is for wives, partners, girlfriends and mothers to come forward, particularly to help with teas on match days. One afternoon per month would solve the present difficulties.
